*FYI: The Social Committee is not part of the HOA Plan for our community. We receive no funding from the HOA and operate almost exclusively on our own.*  The Rivers Run Social Committee has been planning and organizing social events for our community for almost ten years. Three of the current committee members have served for all ten years—Jim Galvin, Sue Rausch and Ginny Phelps. One person has served for more than eight years—Marilyn Kastner. The remaining two members—Mary Hayes and Lynn Musgraves— are newer with two or fewer years of service.

The social committee started when Jim Galvin wanted to have more social activities and was willing to work to make that happen. The first task identified was the need for a newsletter and Ginny Phelps agreed to take on that job. Other members stepped up with ideas and willing hands to start to fill the calendar with social activities and events for all Rivers Run residents. It has been a good run and we appreciate each and every volunteer and participant who has added something to our social life here at Rivers Run.

The good run was interrupted, when Covid came to call and activities were paused. Soon we embraced Zoom for getting back in touch with a few events here and there. With the virus restrictions eased, we are now more or less back on track for having several social options a month. Which brings us to the current dilemma.

Currently, the Social Committee is questioning their role in the community and how, or if, they should move forward with social events and activities. There is no shortage of ideas, but there can be a shortage of participants and volunteers which leads to concern.

In addition, some of the more seasoned committee members have health issues that might limit their ability to lead the

group, continue planning or publishing the newsletter. It seems we are at a crossroads and need input and support from our Rivers Run neighbors as we navigate what lies ahead for our community.

We are asking for each resident to offer input concerning the newsletter and the social calendar here at the cottages. There are a few questions listed in the box above that might help guide your response. The Social Committee topic will be an agenda item at the annual HOA meeting on September 13 and residents can offer input. In addition, we hope to host one or more discussion/ brainstorming sessions in the next few weeks. The goal of these sessions is to provide an opportunity to hear community input, gather ideas and identify areas of improvement. There is also the need for two new volunteers to transition onto the Social Committee. If neither of these meeting options work for you, simply respond to the email with the September newsletter attached. We hope to have input from all residents and to be able to move forward with future decisions.




### NINA...Neighbors In Need of Assistance
